For any monies to be credited as a 2021 donation, they must be received in the church office *by* 3:00 p.m. Wednesday, December 29.


If you are mailing a check, allow at least ten - twelve days for it to get here due to holidays and slow mail delivery.

But often, the loss of a loved one, marriage, job, relationship or countless other circumstances can leave the hope, love, joy, and peace of the season as distant feelings.


