Apartment for an Afghan Refugee Family by Maria Lobo

Jesus said: "For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me."

Matthew 25: 35

Close your eyes for a moment. Imagine what it would be like if you opened your eyes and learned that you had only precious minutes to flee your home. Stay, and you place yourself and your family at risk of great harm. You have only minutes to decide what to take. Your departure means that you will leave behind all else – your home, extended family, work, friends, community -- your entire way of life.

The United Nations Refugee Agency reports that there are currently 26.4 million refugees across the world who have faced this unimaginable plight, half of whom are under the age of 18.

In the coming weeks, approximately 100 Afghan families are expected to be resettled in Oklahoma City. Catholic Charities is the agency coordinating the resettlement. New Hope has agreed to help by completely outfitting an apartment for a refugee family. Your assistance is needed to make this important work a reality.

We are currently identifying donations of furniture, kitchen items, and bedding. Financial donations are also needed since some of the items must be purchased new.



In 1881, Mrs. Taylor recorded this account: I was elected the District President. In my extremity I called upon the Lord, and He helped me and blessed me in my work. Soon at another District meeting, a wonderful sense of Divine power was felt. At this meeting I was surprised by being made a Life Member. When I got home and thought that by the kindness of others, \$20. in my name was sent to bless the world with gospel light, my heart was all broken up and I cried aloud, "What shall I render unto the Lord for all his benefits? A voice said, "You can make a Thank Offering."

I had just sold dried apples and had a \$5. gold piece. At once I thought of the money and said, "Yes, I can and I will!" I left my work - not the poetic kind, but the washtub - kind and told my husband that the Lord had given me a wonderful thought, and I was going to write our district corresponding secretary and tell her about "Thank Offering". Step by step, our women were guided to make a Thank Offering.

At first each woman was asked to give two cents a week. (This was 1881 - two cents per week was a great deal of money then.) Over one million dollars has been given through UMW Thank Offering. This beautiful story of Thanksqiving shows what can happen when one person responds to the still small voice.

The *World Thank Offering* is and has been for many decades an opportunity for personal thanksgiving and learning of mission outreach. Being in mission is sharing our lives and gifts with others that all may be whole persons through Jesus Christ. It is working to eliminate racism, sexism, and loneliness. Mission is Christ's challenge to us to bring the possibility for food, shelter and fulfillment to all of humanity.
