

Warm Fuzzies are given to EMSA and the Oklahoma Highway Patrol for children in stressful or scary situations. These stuffed animals should be large enough to "cuddle" but also small enough to fit in large plastic bags since the workers/

patrols carry them in their vehicles. That makes them immediately

accessible in an emergency involving a child.


Those with obvious "arms and legs" are given to EMSA and used when the child is traumatized to talk but might point to where they hurt. Others are given to OHP.

All the stuffed animals should be ones a small child can hug. The very tiny ones that come in fast-food meals or are beany-baby size do not work. Very large ones cannot be used at all.

All should be new and /or very gently used (clean) with no smells or stains. Thank you!!!


Mary Martha Circle meets the second Thursday of each month

Mark your calendars for October 14 and November 11.



The women enjoyed having Tyler Stone, Organist and Director of Youth Ministries, as our September guest speaker. He told about knowing in seventh grade that he wanted to be a band director and teach music. He pursued that goal by

getting a Master's degree at OCU. In 2020 while working as organist at New Hope, Pastor J.D. Ward asked him to be the youth leader. In that role he could use his teaching skills. He said it has been a rewarding and challenging experience.
