Delta Grace Mission Trip by Donette Johnson

The Mississippi Delta is one of the poorest areas in the United States- -- often described as "a third world country in the heart of America". Historically, the region has remained entrenched in deep poverty. In 2013, the founders of Delta Grace founded this non-profit, multi denominational, faith-based organization that matches mission teams with those in need of home repair.

Since its founding, Delta Grace has hosted over 2,000 missioners and, with their help, has repaired over 150 homes and shared God's grace with hundreds of Delta residents. Delta Grace is housed in Sunflower, MS, in the Sunflower United Methodist Church. Until 2020, this had been an annual trip for New Hope

UMC. The prayer from Delta Grace is: "That volunteers will transform the lives of those they serve and, in turn, have their own lives transformed". That is evident with the volunteers from New Hope.

This year we are scheduled for October 21st-25th. The cost is \$250 per person which will cover breakfast and lunch each day, lodging, and gas for the drive. All tools and supplies are provided. <u>There is a need</u> for all skill levels. This is a great mission trip within a day's drive from OKC.

The homeowners we have worked with are wonderful, the Staff of Delta Grace have become family, and the food of the Delta is amazing (and mostly unhealthy, but sooooo worth it!) but this is still a working trip. We value each member of New Hope that wants to go to serve, but don't want anyone injured during this trip. *Please consider your health and your ability to safely walk without assistive devices, carry tools, tolerate heat, and perform basic tasks.*

As always, keep the staff and the residents of Delta Grace in your prayers.

Warm Fuzzies -- Outreach resumes/ continues in October





Our Warm Fuzzy Program was begun a number of years ago when David Salter chaired an all church meeting and Alison Anderson suggested the ministry. The descriptive name was given by David. I offered to help Alison and when she was unable to continue her daughter Josie and I kept the program going.

Warm Fuzzies are given to EMSA and the Oklahoma Highway Patrol for children in stressful or scary situations. These stuffed animals should be large enough to "cuddle" but also small enough to fit in large plastic bags since the workers/ patrols carry them in their vehicles. That makes them immediately accessible in an emergency involving a child. The very small ones that come in children's meals or are beany-baby size do not work. They should be new and /or very gently used (clean).

Those with obvious "arms and legs" are given to EMSA and used when the child is traumatized to talk but might point to where they hurt. Others are given to OHP.

Recent records have not been kept but, at last count a couple of years back, New Hope folks had donated more than 5000 warm fuzzies: 2675 to EMSA, 311 to Piedmont and 2063 to OHP!



At the request of EMSA we have also given over three hundred baby blankets to help keep babies warm when EMSA finds them in a situation where the home does not have enough heat.

Thank you, New Hope, for being such a loving, caring group of people. I know you will continue to support JOY class as they take over the leadership/ sponsorship of this wonderful ministry. Also, we are continuing the collection of used eyeglasses, reading glasses or cases. Susan Smith will gather these to be given to Skyline.

Remember, the need for all these outreaches never goes away, unfortunately!

September Discipleship and Mission Update

August brought continued evolution of our partnerships with Ralph Downs Elementary and Putnam City North High School! We are looking forward to growing and serving alongside the faculty, students, and parents at both schools. Sixty-one volunteers came to the orientation day August 23! Thank all of you who helped/participated!

September will bring the official launch of Whiz Kids! For 25 years, Whiz Kids has brought together caring adults and elementary-age children for one-on-one tutoring and mentoring. Our regular Whiz Kids gatherings will be Monday afternoons from 3-5 PM and are scheduled to begin September 13th!

Volunteers are needed to fill different roles: tutors/mentors for twenty-three 1st - 4th graders from Ralph Downs Elementary School. So that each child can have the same tutor, tutors/mentors need to be present each week for the whole school year (barring sickness or appointments).

Participation each week is not needed for these positions. Instead, a schedule will be developed by the team leader:

Transportation team - van drivers and accompanying riders will pick up children at Ralph Downs and transport them to New Hope in New Hope's vans. (4 needed each week)

Set-up team - arrives early and puts out needed items and pre-packaged snacks on tables as well as getting books & games ready. (3 needed each week) Homemade Cookie team - to make and bring homemade cookies at 4:45 PM, hand them out to

the kids as they leave, and collect name tags. (1 needed each week) Subs are needed for all positions.

The 2021 session of the annual meeting of the Oklahoma Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church will be held this fall on various dates and venues. As of today, registration is open and you are invited to complete that process at your earliest convenience. The registration link is: <u>Annual Conference Registration</u>

The deadline to register is September 30. No changes can be made after that date.

Theme: "Sowing Seeds, Reaping Harvests and Transforming the World" is this year's conference theme. Based on Paul's second letter to the church at Corinth, we are reminded that times were uncertain then just as they are now. Yet, the great apostle says that God is able to provide for them "every blessing in abundance" so they could give cheerfully and be "enriched in every way" because of this generosity. The people of Oklahoma sow seeds bountifully, reap harvest cheerfully and transform the world boldly.

During this conference, we celebrate the 25th anniversary of the Order of Deacon. These men and women have faithfully served our conference through local churches, extension ministries & non-profit organizations, connecting the church and the world. We will celebrate the 60th anniversary of the Woodworth Trust and the many ways those dollars, given cheerfully by WW and Rose Woodworth, have transformed the world. We will also ordaining nine persons, commissioning eight persons, consecrating one deaconess and honoring the faithful service of 30 retirees.

A hybrid gathering All portions of the annual conference session will be livestreamed. Voting will take place via the Good News Television voting platform, whether you attend in person or online.

Should you choose not to attend the in-person business session, you will be able to fully participate via the online platform. There are some changes to the voting platform to make it easier to use. Since we will be offering this hybrid session, there will be <u>two training sessions to acquaint you with the system</u>:

- Sunday, October 3rd at 4 p.m.
- Tuesday, October 5th at 7 p.m.

Voting Each member of the Annual Conference will need a personal device for voting. These are not provided by the conference. The device needs to be able to access the internet and utilize Wi-Fi, if you attend in person. Note: your voting number is unique to you and is issued to you as a member of the conference. If you are not able to attend and your church will use a previously elected alternate lay member, that needs to be reported to the conference office so a unique voter identification number can be assigned to that person. This number is not to be shared.

If you have served as an Equalization Lay Member in the past, please check with your church and/or district office prior to registering unless you have already been elected during a special charge conference at your church. Voter identification numbers issued last year are not valid this year. You will receive a new number in a

separate email from the annual conference closer to the event.

Links to live streaming of the worship services, vote training, clergy executive session and business session will be sent to you closer to each date. They will also be available on the Conference web site.

Offering In light of our theme and the 100th observance of the Tulsa Race Massacre, we encourage cheerful giving to this year's annual conference offering which will be used to benefit ongoing work of planting new faith communities and reaching needs of the Greenwood area of Tulsa. More information will come from Bishop Nunn's office in early fall.

COVID-19 precautions We are monitoring the situation regarding COVID-19 and spikes connected to the Delta variant. The safety of our conference members and guests is of upmost importance to us. By the time we meet, we may require masks be worn inside the church. We also encourage members of the conference attending in-person be fully vaccinated by the time of our meeting.

The children are going to the OKC Zoo on Saturday, September 11th! *We will meet there*




