

Lenten Study: Three Simple Rules-A Wesleyan Way of Living by Pastor Marla Lobo
While there are no references in the Bible to Lent, we know that early Christians observed with great devotion the days of Jesus' passion and resurrection. It became the custom of the Church that before the Easter celebration there should be a forty-day season of spiritual preparation.

One author writes that Lent is a single season with a double focus: 1) it is a time for self-reflection of our human condition, including our sin and its deadly consequences and 2) it is an equally intense time to consider new possibilities offered us through Jesus Christ.

During this season of Lent, you are invited to take part in our church-wide study of the book "Three
 Simple Rules- A Wesleyan Way of Living" by Bishop Rueben Job.
Grounded in Scripture, Three Simple Rules explores three basic tenets of our Methodist tradition that were shaped, taught, and lived by John Wesley, the principal founder of Methodism.

Three Simple Rules is a four-week study. Our children and youth will be discovering the Three Simple Rules as part of their regular meetings. Several adult Sunday School classes at New Hope are also taking part in this study.

## Books are available to all participants at no cost and are in the Gathering Area.
