
Happy Mothers' Day

The United Methodist Women in Faith are happy to announce that Keith Dobbs, the Executive Director of Criminal Justice and Mercy Ministries Inc. of Oklahoma (CJAMM) will be guest speak-

er at our next meeting on Thursday, May 19 at 6:30 p.m. Keith is a dynamic speaker and is enthused about "Breaking the Generational Cycles of Incarcerations".

For the last 25 years, CJAMM has operated a tried-and-true, successful, faith-based, re-entry program from incarceration to second chances as successful citizens. CJAMM operates the Exodus House programs and New Day Camp (a camp for children with at least one incarcerated parent) on a shoestring budget and with lots of prayers.

CJAMM, a ministry of The Oklahoma Conference of the United Methodist Church, is funded solely by donations from individuals and a handful of foundations and corporations. CJAMM receives NO state or federal dollars although they provide a service to the state that exceeds millions of dollars in value.

We invite **everyone** to join us on May 19th at the Church as we hear stories about CJAMM programs and their impressive 3.1 percent recidivism. That means that almost 97 percent of those who have completed the program within the last seven years have not reoffended or been reincarcerated. Great news!

They asked that the cast, director and anyone else involved be complimented and told how much this was enjoyed. It's wonderful to be able to pass on these kind words!




