Whiz Kids

Whiz Kids returns to New Hope in August! If you are new to Whiz Kids, here is a little background information: Whiz Kids, sponsored by City Care, is a highly successful, faith-based, city-wide, one-on-one tutoring/mentoring program for kids in 1st-5th grades. Established in 1996, Whiz Kids targets students who are reading below grade level and who could benefit most from a mentor relationship with a caring adult. The program is more than tutoring. It involves learning about God, playing games, improving literacy, loving, celebrating, meeting goals, experiencing special guests, having conversations, building relationships, and receiving blessings.

We finished the 2021-2022 school year with 30 children. And we hope to serve even more children this year! During Worship on August 14 & 21, you'll get to learn more about Whiz Kids at New Hope. Different areas where volunteers are needed include: drivers and riders who transport kids from school to New Hope, folks who prepare and serve a snack, tutors, and substitutes in all areas.

Wednesday Night Adult Education Classes

Pastor Rod and Pastor Marla will be leading two different studies on Wednesday evenings from 6:30-7:30 PM.

Celtic Spirituality – Part 1: September 7, 14, and 21. Led by Pastor Rod, this study will look at the origins and practice of Christianity among the Celtic people of Ireland. No book is required.

Christianity and World Religions: September 28, October 5, 12, 19, and 26. Led by Pastor Marla, this study will use the video Christianity and World Religions (Revised) by Adam Hamilton to explore four major world religions—Hinduism, Buddhism, Islam, and Judaism—and compare the beliefs of each with those of Christianity. No book is required but a book can be purchased by anyone wanting more information.

Celtic Spirituality – Part 2: November 2, 9, and 16. In Part 2 of this study, Pastor Rod will look at the contributions of the Celtic people to Christian art and spiritual practices. No book is required.
