In reflecting on 2023, we have much to celebrate. Our missions and ministries continue to grow as we reach ever more people. Our existing ministries, serving people of all ages, continued to bless the lives of many. We received 47 new members, bringing 7 children with them and 2 clergy placed their charge conference membership with New Hope. Our new members came by profession of faith and from 16 different congregations.

We added new programs this year, including Bible studies for men and women and a women's book club. Our music ministry enriches us in our worship services and beyond. Every week we feel it can't get any better, then it does! Our first outdoor summer concert brought in a large crowd and drew many people to our choir and orchestra. The new bell choir brought even more people into our music program. This all came together at Carols of Hope where among the choir, orchestra, bells, and children, 80 different musicians participated.

At of the time of this writing, the final financial numbers for 2023 are still being calculated but we're on track to end the year in a strong position. New Hope continued its tradition of paying 100% of what we were apportioned by the United Methodist Conference to fund missions and ministry locally and throughout the world. Our estimate of giving campaign for 2024 fully covers the 2024 projected budget. Your generous financial gifts are an indication of your spiritual commitment and allow us to invest in projects outside the budget that support our ministries even more effectively.



Men of Hope: meet the 3rd Sunday of each month at New Hope for breakfast at 8AM. The Men of Hope undertake various service projects and philanthropic endeavors.

Young at Heart: meets on the 4th Thursday of each month. This fellowship group often travels to locations of interest in the OKC metro and sometimes around the state. Young at Heart gatherings always include great fellowship and good food!

Women's Circles: The Mary/Martha Circle meets the 2nd Thursday at 9:30AM. The Ruth Circle meets the 2nd Tuesday of each month at 6:30 PM.

2nd Saturday Homeless Outreach: New Hope comes alongside neighbors who are currently homeless with friendship, encouragement, food, clothing, bedding, and toiletry items. The 2nd Saturday of each month from 9:30 AM-Noon, volunteers from New Hope travel downtown and across OKC to support our homeless neighbors.

Food Pantry and Blessing Box: The New Hope Food Pantry and Blessing Box provides shelf-stable food to our neighbors experiencing food insecurity. The Blessings Box is available at all times and the food pantry is open the 2nd and 4th Tuesday each month from 1-3 PM.

Stitchers Sewing Group: Blankets, pillowcases, and more are created by the Stitchers and given to patrons of social services agencies such as The Infant Crisis Center and the YWCA. All skill levels are welcome! The Stitchers sewing group meets on the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month from 11 AM - 3 PM.

Whiz Kids: Each Monday afternoon from 3-5 PM during the school year at New Hope, Whiz Kids brings together caring adults and elementary-age children for one-on-one tutoring and mentoring. New Hope partners with Ralph Downs Elementary.


