#### **Mission Trip Test Drive**

God is at work in the world - in our community and across the globe. As followers of Christ, we seek to prayerfully discern God's leading and watch for opportunities to serve where God is calling us. Mission trips are an important part of our Christian service. They provide opportunities to foster understanding and build relationships. If you are new to mission trips or can't travel overnight, you are invited to take part in a special New Hope Mission trip on Saturday, July 30th. In collaboration with the Oklahoma Indian Missionary Conference (OIMC), we will be serving at the OIMC Clinton Indian Church and Community Center to support their project to help native children in Clinton to prepare for the upcoming school year. There are 81 OIMC churches state of Oklahoma, three in Kansas, one in Missouri, and one in Dallas, Texas. In addition, there fellowships and community centers. Our Bishop, Jimmy Nunn, also serves as the Episcopal leader of the OIMC. As you may know, Methodism first arrived in Oklahoma through our Native sisters and brothers. Here are the details for our trip:

Mission Trip Test Drive - Saturday, July 30th - 8:30 AM — 6:00 PM Clinton Indian Church and Community Center - Clinton, OK Transportation will be provided.

We will help children from the Cheyenne/Arapaho tribe and their families prepare for the school year! This is a community event where the children receive free haircuts, toiletries, and school supplies. We will play games with the children and help with a community meal. Also, there is a required preparatory meeting on Sunday, July 24th from noon-1:30 PM at New Hope. We will finalize trip logistics and learn important information about the Cheyenne/Arapaho tribes. You can sign up in the Gathering Area or use the link in the New Hope eNote. Also, we are collecting the following items (40 of each): Deodorant, small bottles of shampoo & conditioner, combs, brushes, hair gel, pony tails, scrunchies, and barrettes. Look for the collection box at the New Hope Donation Center!

During the season of Pentecost, we remember the day the disciples received the Holy Spirit in a special way. The story in Acts 2



describes a powerful wind and tongues of fire as the Holy Spirit was poured out on people from all over the world who came to Jerusalem to celebrate a Jewish feast. At the first Pentecost over 3000 people were baptized, creating the first church.

This is why Pentecost is known as the birthday of the Christian church. The word Pentecost comes from a Greek word meaning fiftieth. The Christian festival of Pentecost falls on the 50th day after the resurrection of Jesus.

Two colors are historically associated with Pentecost. Red is a visual reminder of the "tongues of fire" that empowered the apostles and others to proclaim the good news of Christ's resurrection in many languages to the crowds of pilgrims from many lands (Acts 2:3). White was used in some places, including England, where Pentecost had also become a day for baptisms by the Middle Ages. It was also sometimes known as Whitsunday since then those being baptized often wore white robes.

We wish a warm, New Hope welcome to all of our new members who joined the church in June!

We always need donations of water bottles, sun screen, bug spray, flip flops, and t-shirts, but did you know there is a need for bed sheets? They are used to wrap up at night to keep bugs (mostly mosquitoes) from biting exposed sections of skin. Twin size is the best so they can be folded up fairly small and fit into a backpack.

Each month we provide a sack lunch with sandwiches, chips, snacks and water bottles, as well as other portable food, but we have recently started to provide fresh donuts and milk. Even though the nutritional value is low, we believe it is important to remember we are all God's children and if something as simple as a donut can brighten someone's day, then we'll do our best to provide a donut.
